



A TRACER STUDY ON ETEEAP GRADUATES OF NORTHWESTERN UNIVERSITY

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This study utilized the descriptive survey method of research to trace the ETEEAP graduates from the College of Criminal Justice Education (CCJE) of Northwestern University. It determined the profile of the graduates before joining the police service and before applying to ETEEAP. It further determined the number of respondents who were given alternative learning modules and the number of subjects under the BS Criminology curriculum that were accredited after a thorough assessment on the trainings and work experiences of the applicants. Moreover, the profile of the graduates and the number of police personnel in the province that are expected to avail of the program were also determined.

The results of the study will provide relevant accurate information to CHED for policy planning purposes. It will serve also as a basis of the College of Criminal Justice Education and NWU in enriching the program. Results of the study will serve as bases for the provincial government of Ilocos Norte in providing assistance to its police personnel to apply to the ETEEAP, thus, producing pool of human resources that are globally competitive and greatly contributing to the province's development. Findings of the study will provide the administration a clearer picture of the effectiveness and relevance of the program thus providing basis for good planning and better implementation of the program. The results also of the study will help the Office of Alumni Affairs in tracing and updating the databank of graduates. It will also be of use to the Philippine National Police, curriculum planners, concerned government officials, the academe, and to future researchers.

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
