



## **CORRELATION OF TERTIARY INSTRUCTORS' PROFILE AND PERFORMANCE LEVEL AT NORTHWESTERN UNIVERSITY**

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The study determined the correlation of the profile and performance level of tertiary instructors at Northwestern University for the School Year 2000-2001.

The descriptive-correlational method of research was utilized in this endeavour in which 77 tertiary instructors were purposively taken as samples.

Data gathered were analysed and interpreted using frequency counts expressed in percentage and the chi square test. Level of significance was set at .05.

Findings of this study showed that : 1) majority of the tertiary instructors are females, belong to 26-35 years old bracket, married and are receiving PHP 6001.00-PHP 8000.00; 2) majority of them are BS/AB degree holders, have more than 6 years of teaching experience, and have attended local regional/ national training/ seminars/ workshops; 3) majority of them are good performers; 4) the personal characteristics such as age gender, salary, and civil status were found not significantly related to their performance; 5) their professional characteristics such as as length of teaching experience and the number of trainings/ seminars attended were found not related to their performance. However, their educational attainment influenced their performance.

Generally, tertiary instructors of NWU are good performers and their educational attainment were found out to be significantly related to their performance. Meaning, the higher the educational attainment, the higher their performance.

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
